OUR WBC STORY

Whangaparaoa Baptist had its beginnings in 1955 when Roy and Sophie Thompson arrived in Whangaparaoa, and gathering a few other keen Christians together, the first services were held in the Whangaparaoa Hall on Sunday afternoons.



In 1957 with help from the Baptist Union, two sections were purchased. The site was cleared with a small wheel tractor, the pine stumps were blasted out with gelignite, and building began! People from all over New Zealand donated money and materials, and with the help of many volunteers, and the paid labour of a single tradesman, the building took shape.

Whangaparaoa Baptist Church was opened on August 30th 1958 (this original building is now our church café). The church grew and in 1975 the current auditorium was built, there was a building upgrade in 2000, and a major refurbishment in 2018/2019.

Throughout the years WBC has continued to thrive as a local church interwoven into its community. The church has been blessed with wonderful volunteers, and a pioneering attitude which has embraced new initiatives and ways of doing things. Miss Gladys Turkington's (church pianist in the first few years) prayer... "Lord, make this work to be as a lighthouse for our Lord on the peninsula" is as apt today as it was then.

Sundays at 9.45am

Look out for the WBC Kids Welcome Desk in the foyer – our team will help register your kids. Check-in is open 10mins before the service, and again when the kids go out of the service to First Steps and WBC Kids.

During school terms we are in the 9.45am service for the first 15 minutes, and then we go out to our kids spaces.

All our volunteers are carefully selected, and police vetted.

We have lots of fun in our Kids space! Discover more about the Bible and God, and hang out with a whole lot of other kids! We have a wonderful team of leaders who love being with kids and being part of their faith journey.

You are welcome to stay with your child until they feel comfortable in our First Steps space, and there is a screen so you can still see and hear the service. Safety is important to us, so all children must be signed in and out by a parent or caregiver.

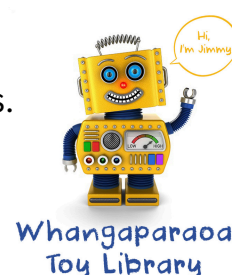
